

TITLE IX: COVID-19 UPDATE

What is Title IX?

Title IX is a federal law, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex at Saint Louis University. More specifically, under SLU's Sexual Misconduct Policy, the following conduct is prohibited: sexual assault, sexual harassment, intimate partner violence, stalking, sexual exploitation, and retaliation.

When does Title IX apply?

Title IX applies regardless of when or where something occurs. Thus, if you experience unwanted behavior off-campus, know that the SLU Title IX Office and resources are still available to support you. Title IX applies whether or not the person who has reportedly harmed someone is SLU affiliated or not.

Who is available to help?

SLU's Title IX resources, support, and administration remain available to you during this public health crisis.
